

PRODUCTION AND DELIVERIES OF ENERGY PRODUCTS, SEPTEMBER 2015^{1, 2}

Production of energy products

In September 2015 compared to August 2015 an increase is reported for the production of:

• solid fuels - by 7.7% to 3 609 thousand tonnes;

• natural gas - by 20.0% to 6 million m³.

A decrease is reported for the production of:

- liquefied petroleum gases by 22.2% to 7 thousand tonnes;
- unleaded motor gasoline by 8.8% to 145 thousand tonnes;
- transport diesel by 5.1% to 188 thousand tonnes;
- electricity by 13.2% to 3 564 GWh (Annex, Table 1).

In September 2015 compared to September 2014 an increase is reported for the production of:

- solid fuels by 33.5%;
- electricity by 2.4%.

A decrease is reported for the production of:

- liquefied petroleum gases by 12.5%;
- unleaded motor gasoline by 5.2%;
- transport diesel by 1.6%;
- natural gas by 45.5%.

Deliveries of energy products

In September 2015 compared to August 2015 an increase is reported for the deliveries of:

- solid fuels by 7.5% to 3 697 thousand tonnes;
- A decrease is reported for the deliveries of:
 - liquefied petroleum gases by 18.4% to 40 thousand tonnes;
 - unleaded motor gasoline by 7.7% to 36 thousand tonnes;
 - transport diesel by 13.4% to 161 thousand tonnes;
 - natural gas by 11.8% to 172 million m³;
 - electricity by 4.0% to 2 442 GWh (Annex, Table 2).

¹ The survey on energy products is conducted every month in accordance with the Regulation (EO) \mathbb{N} 1099/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 22 November 2008 on energy statistics, amended by the Commission Regulation (EU) No 147/2013 of 13 February 2013 of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards the implementation of updates for the monthly and annual energy statistics. The survey aims to submit information on the production and inland deliveries of the main energy products - electricity, solid fuels, natural gas and petroleum products. The reporting units are producers, importers and exporters of energy products. Production and deliveries of the energy products are the main observed indicators.

In September 2015 compared to September 2014 an increase is reported for the deliveries of:

- solid fuels by 28.5%;
- liquefied petroleum gases by 5.3%;
- unleaded motor gasoline by 9.1%;
- natural gas by 3.6%;
- electricity by 1.0%.

A decrease is reported for the deliveries of:

• transport diesel - by 14.8%.



Methodological notes

Solid fuels

Production - includes Hard coal, Lignite and Solid fuels from coal. Producers report quantities calculated after any operation for removal of inert matter.

Deliveries - quantities delivered to the internal market. They are equal to the total of the deliveries to the different types of consumers: producers' own use, main activity power stations, coking plants and patent fuel plants, industry, iron and steel industry and others.

Petroleum products

Production - includes production of finished products at a refinery or blending plant.

Deliveries - wholesale deliveries to the domestic market of finished petroleum products from producers, importers/exporters.

Deliveries of petroleum products are defined as: primary product receipts + gross refinery output + recycled products - refinery fuel + imports - exports - international marine bunkers + interproduct transfers - products transferred - stock changes.

Natural gas

Production - includes all dry marketable production within national boundaries including offshore production. Production is measured after purification and extraction of NGLs and sulphur.

Deliveries - total natural gas, distributed for the internal market, including own use and losses. This is defined as: *Indigenous production* + *Imports* – *Exports* – *Stock change*.

Data are presented in million cubic metres assuming reference gas conditions 15° C and 101.325 kPa.

Electricity

Production - includes produced electricity from Thermal power plants, Nuclear power plant, Hydro power plants, Pumped storage plant and electricity, obtained from wind generators and solar panels. *Deliveries* - sum of net produced electricity and net import.





Figure 1. Production and deliveries of solid fuels

Figure 2. Production and deliveries of liquefied petroleum gases












Figure 4. Production and deliveries of transport diesel











Figure 6. Production and deliveries of electricity



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
